



Ballard "Morris" Roberts

February 28, 1930 - October 15, 2014

Ballard "Morris" Roberts, 84, of Blackwater, VA went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, October 15, 2014 at Hancock County Hospital.

A native of Blackwater, he was born February 28, 1930 to the late George and Mattie Roberts. In addition to his parents he was preceded in death by five sisters, Ollie Richardson, Sarah Horton, Lillie Peters, Edna Johnson and Martha Kate Livesay, and by two brothers, Calvin Roberts and L.B. Roberts.

Morris was an Army veteran having served during the Korean Conflict. He had worked as a carpenter all his life and had worked 25 years for Floyd Pennington Construction. He was a faithful and dedicated servant of Christ and had served as a deacon at Sarepta Missionary Baptist Church in Blackwater for over 50 years. He also served as a singer, Sunday School Teacher and Trustee.

He is survived by his devoted wife of 60 years, Edith Stewart Roberts; two sisters, Ina Duff of Pennington Gap, VA and Evelyn Maples of Kingsport, TN; special niece, Nancy Moles; special friend, Cheryl Thomas; and several other beloved nieces and nephews.

The family will receive friends from 6 until 8:00 p.m. Friday, October 17, 2014 at Robinette Funeral Home in Blackwater. The funeral service will be held at

11:00 a.m. Saturday, October 18, at Sarepta Baptist Church in Blackwater with Pastor Glen Hurd and Rev. Donnie Shaw officiating. Music will be provided by the Sarepta Baptist Church Choir. The graveside service will follow in the Trent Cemetery.
