“ Andy was one of the best friends i ever had. Almost every memory i have of hunting, fishing, swarming around on the river bank, and just growing up is filled with him. Me, Bryan, and Andy....those were the best days of my life. I miss you both and think about you every day.

I remember wading Wallen Creek one hot summer day below the big culvert in the spring hollow on the Albert farm. We were catching every red eye, bass, bluegill and choke prick in the creek. Of course I had caught more than Andy so he started walking through the good fishing holes before I got a chance to fish them...as usual. Then we came to the best spot in that stretch of the creek. It was a deeper, fast moving hole in front of a big 6 ft x 6 ft limestone boulder that, sometime in the geologic past of Wallen Creek, had rolled of the bluff and out into the creek about 10-15 ft. The only way to fish it was from on top of that rock but the 10-15 ft between the bank and the rock was stagnant, smelly, nasty water over about a foot of mud. Being the brains of the duo I immediately devised a plan...we could lay a small tree limb from the bank to the tall rock and walk right up it like a tight rope...no problem. So, Andy would hold all our gear while I tried it out first. Boogety, boogety, boogety right up the pole I went to the top of the rock. Now, seeing how easy it was for me, Andy came to the conclusion that he could do that carrying all our gear, he needed no help from the likes of me...he backs up a step or two and starts to run up the pole which is about the size of my wrist. And it's going pretty good for him right up to the final lunge for solid ground and the pole rolls under his feet. He tosses our stuff onto the rock as his feet lose their purchase on the pole and I look him in the eyes as he falls...straddling the limb for a split second before landing on his side in the quagmire. Funniest thing I have ever seen and I am making sure Andy knows just how funny I think it is. And without a word he gets up, walks around the rock and right through that fishing hole too.... I miss you already buddy.
