



Carol Ann (Penn) Skeen

October 7, 1937 - April 14, 2026

Carol Ann (Penn) Skeen, age 88, of Ewing, Virginia passed away surrounded by her family on Tuesday, April 14, 2026. She was born on October 7, 1937 at the Fort Jay Army Base in New York City.

A true Army Brat, Carol grew up across the United States in places like Colorado Springs, Puerto Rico, Blackstone, Virginia, and Philips, Wisconsin, before starting and finishing high school at Fort Knox High School in Kentucky. Fresh off a bus from Louisville to study History at Lincoln Memorial University in Harrogate, TN, she met her future husband and life-long partner, Ronald Skeen, when he helped unload her bags when she arrived on campus in September 1955.

She began her 44 year-long career as a teacher at Forge Ridge High School where she taught English and Typing before landing at Thomas Walker High School in 1963 where she influenced students' lives all the way through her retirement in 2003. Detailed and driven, she was a true believer in the power of hard work and always stood up for an underdog.

Carol was beloved to all who knew her for her independence, ideals, humor, honesty, and especially her loyalty. She loved her family, friends, and finding a good deal. A long-time member of Christ of the Cumberland Lutheran Church of Harrogate, TN, she taught Sunday School and played the organ for

many years.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 67 years, Ronald Lee Skeen, of Ewing, VA and son Jerry Ronald Skeen, of Lexington, KY; she is survived by grandson, Collin Alexander Skeen and wife Diana Jean Skeen, of Lafayette, CA; granddaughter, Hunter Katherine King and husband Air Force Captain Bradley Wayne King, great-grandchildren Oaklyn, Odin, and Tilian King of Omaha, NE; and sister, Gloria Penn Gerould, of Sandston, VA.

Now finally reunited, she tirelessly cared for her husband Ronald until his death in 2024, never wavering in her commitment to their partnership and marriage. Whether supporting him during his long coaching career or traveling across the South for classic car shows, they spent their many decades together, teaching at Thomas Walker, raising their family, and supporting their community.

The family will receive friends from 5 until 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 16, 2026 at Robinette Funeral Home in Rose Hill, VA. A Celebration of Life will follow at 7:00 p.m. with pastor Gordon Smith officiating.

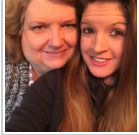
