Kermit Livesay, 79, of Jonesville, VA passed away on Saturday, June 7, 2025 at Lee County Community Hospital.

He was born on June 24, 1945 in Lee County, VA to the late Gay Emmett Livesay and Pearl Hyden Livesay. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by four sisters, Helen Qualls, Lorene Lee, Mary Hobbs and Joyce Hettich, and one brother, Dwight Livesay.

Kermit was a Vietnam Veteran who served in the Army for five years. He was of the Baptist Faith. He had worked for Lanningham Oil Company, later Lee Oil Company, and operated his own businesses that included installing and maintaining heaters, farming, as well as other endeavors.
