Virginia Edith Langley, 94, of Hagan, VA, passed away on Wednesday, March 15, 2023, at Ridgecrest Manor Nursing Home.

She was born in Lee County on April 9, 1929, to the late Lucy and Felix Langley. Virginia was a lifelong resident of Lee County. She taught Math and Science for the Lee County School System until her retirement after 38 years of teaching.

Virginia loved the outdoors whether it was riding her tractor to mow the large farmyard or hiking in the mountains that surrounded her home place. She could name every wildflower that grows in Lee County.

In addition to her parents, her sisters, Martha Ingram, Myrtle Langley, Stella Orr, and Nellie Langley and her brother, Alfred Langley, preceded in her death.

She is survived by her brother Billy Langley and his wife, Sue, of Virginia; nephews Everett and Henry Ingram, of New Mexico, Jeffrey Langley, of Colorado and Christopher Langley, of Virginia; along with many great-nieces and great-nephews.
