Vivian Lorene Ingle, age 89, passed away on Sunday, November 8, 2020 at Lee Health and Rehab Center. She was born on Thursday, September 10, 1931 in Hubbard Springs, VA, the oldest child of Roy and Ethel Presley Ingle. Lorene had resided in Rose Hill, VA since 1972.

She was a faithful member of Hardy's Creek Baptist Church from an early age and attended faithfully as long as her health permitted.

Lorene graduated from Flatwoods High School and received degrees from LMU and UT. She taught business classes and accounting at Jonesville High School, retiring in 1988.

She was preceded in death by her parents; two brothers, Donald and Rufus and two sisters, Ruby and Reba.

She is survived by numerous cousins and a host of friends, including church family, neighbors and former students.

A graveside funeral will be held on Thursday, November 12, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. in the Ingle Cemetery in Jonesville, VA. Services will be conducted by Pastor Ronnie Sizemore and Pastor Steve Neff.
