March 18, 1947 - July 8, 2021

Born on Wallens Creek in Lee County, Virginia, Bill spent his childhood working on the farm. He was a graduate of Jonesville High School in 1965. Soon after graduation, Bill joined the US Army growing to the rank of Sergeant First Class (E7) with specialization as Communications Instructor and Crypto Repairman. He earned honors with 3 combat tours and over 33 years of service. He retired to return from overseas after the passing of his father, honorable discharge January 30, 1990. Bill was a pillar of the Lee County Farming Community and his legacy will live on through those who loved him. Though Bill never called himself a dad, the lives of those he mentored and touched are forever changed. We are all truly blessed to have known Bill Warner. Though he is gone, he is not forgotten.
